




This approach brings the stories closer to home, illuminating nuanced emotions in a way that feels both vivid and entirely distinct from our familiar understanding.






Stage One, 2023















The Sad Realities of Pain, 2022





















White paper: Jesudara Hinmikaiye Black paper: Jung Min Lee




Joy, 2024 Screenprint on cotton fabric Size variable












Stay Alive For Me, 2023




Work in progress:

Each cut out fabric was hand stitched to mimic natural forms such as fungus, mushrooms and flowers. These flowerlike structures made from fabric were eventually affixed to a found log of wood in a deliberate manner.





Kabba, 2023






Untitled, 2022

















Work in progress:
